## CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA APRIL UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 13.3%

**Note:** The data contained in this news release reflects the effects of COVID-19 and mitigation efforts to contain it.

HARRISBURG (JUNE 2) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was 13.3 percent in April, up 8.3 percentage points from March. This was the highest rate for the local MSA since August 1983. The statewide unemployment rate was 15.1 percent, up 9.3 percentage points over the month while the national rate rose 10.3 percentage points to 14.7 percent in April.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA decreased 13.9 percent over the month (-8,700) to 54,000 in April, the lowest level since October 2004. Over the year, jobs were down 12.8 percent (-7,900) in the MSA, while statewide jobs declined 17.2 percent.

April's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)

Both goods producing and service providing jobs declined in every MSA with most published industries down from March. All published supersectors in the local MSA were down, with the largest decline in leisure & hospitality both locally as well as statewide.

Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

<sup>2/</sup> Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.
