CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA JUNE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 11.2%

Note: *The data contained in this news release reflects the effects of COVID-19 and evolving mitigation efforts to contain it.*

HARRISBURG (JULY 28) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was 11.2 percent in June, down 0.2 percentage points from May. The statewide unemployment rate was 13.0 percent, down 0.4 percentage points over the month and the national rate fell 2.2 points from May to 11.1 percent.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA increased 3.0 percent over the month (+1,700) to 57,500 in June. Over the year, jobs were down 7.1 percent (-4,400) in the MSA, while statewide jobs declined 10.2 percent.

June's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail (see Table 2)

Both goods producing and private service providing industries added jobs over the month in all 18 MSAs. All published supersectors, except government, in the local MSA added jobs from May.

FOOTNOTES

1/ Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

2/ Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

3/ Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.

4/ Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
