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CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA JANUARY UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 4.0%

HARRISBURG (MARCH 17) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was 4.0 percent in January. The statewide and national rates were 5.4 percent and 4.0 percent, respectively.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA increased 0.5 percent over the month (+300) to 59,800 in January. Over the year, jobs were up 2.4 percent (+1,400) in the MSA, while statewide jobs increased 3.8 percent.

January's Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail

Over the month, all seven published supersectors' movements were small, with the only change of over 100 being a seasonal drop of 300 trade, transportation & utilities jobs. Over the year, five of the seven supersectors increased with the largest movement in trade, transportation & utilities (+1,200).

NOTE: Because the data included in each month's press release (primarily civilian labor force and nonfarm jobs data) are sample based, the data are subject to revisions. Once each year, estimates are adjusted to new levels based on additional or revised information collected after the initial release of the data (called a benchmark). Additionally, seasonal adjustment factors for historical labor force and nonfarm jobs data are updated each year. Revisions to the nonfarm jobs series through 2021 have been completed and are reflected in the January news release. Revisions to the historical labor force series have not been completed and are not yet reflected in the January news release. Historical labor force revisions are expected to be completed by the release of March data in late April 2022. V Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

^{2/} Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

^{3/} Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
