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CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 3.2% IN JUNE

HARRISBURG (AUGUST 1) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was down one-tenth of a percentage point over the month to 3.2 percent in June. The state unemployment rate declined by two-tenths of a point to 3.8 percent in June, while the national rate fell one-tenth of a point to 3.6 percent. Over the year, the local MSA's rate declined by six-tenths of a percentage point, the Pennsylvania rate declined by five-tenths and the national rate was unchanged at 3.6 percent.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA were up 100 over the month to a record high of 62,900 in June. Over the year, jobs were up 1.8 percent (+1,100) in the MSA, while statewide jobs increased 2.6 percent.

June Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail

Job changes in all seven published supersectors were mostly small over the month and seasonally driven. Over the year, jobs increased in six of the seven with the largest movement in professional and business services (+500).

FOOTNOTES

- 1) Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.
- 2) Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.
- 3) Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
- 4) Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
