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CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA JUNE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 2.8%

HARRISBURG (JULY 30) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was unchanged over the month at 2.8 percent in June 2024. The state unemployment rate was unchanged over the month at 3.4 percent in June while the national rate was up one-tenth of a percentage point to 4.1 percent.

Seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs in the Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA were essentially unchanged over the month at 61,700 in June. Over the year, jobs were up 1.0 percent (+600) in the MSA, while statewide jobs increased 1.6 percent.

June Not Seasonally Adjusted Nonfarm Jobs Detail

Job levels had small gains or were essentially unchanged over the month in five of the seven published supersectors. The largest movements were an increase of 300 in leisure & hospitality and decline of 300 in government, both seasonal in nature. Over the year, trade, transportation & utilities had the largest gain, up 600 jobs, while government had the largest decline among published supersectors, down 300 from June 2023.

FOOTNOTES

- 1) Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.
- 2) Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.
- 3) Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.
- 4) Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
