CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA MARCH UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 3.3%

HARRISBURG (APRIL 30) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) was unchanged in March at 3.3 percent. The Chambersburg-Waynesboro and Harrisburg-Carlisle MSAs tied for the fourth-lowest unemployment rate among the state's 18 MSAs. The Gettysburg, Lancaster, and State College MSAs tied for the lowest rate at 3.0 percent, while the East Stroudsburg and Scranton--Wilkes-Barre--Hazleton MSAs had the highest at 4.8 percent. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for Pennsylvania and the United States were 3.9 percent and 3.8 percent, respectively.

Franklin County's unemployment rate tied Bucks and Butler counties for the ninth-lowest rate among Pennsylvania's 67 counties in March. Unemployment rates and rankings of neighboring counties were: Fulton (3.7%, t-18th); Huntingdon (5.1%, 65th); Juniata (3.7%, t-18th); Perry (3.2%, t-7th); Cumberland (2.9%, 2nd); and Adams (3.0%, t-3rd). Unemployment rates across Pennsylvania ranged from 2.8 percent in Chester County to 6.0 percent in Forest County.

The Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA's *seasonally adjusted* total nonfarm jobs were essentially unchanged from February at 62,500. Over the year, jobs were up 2.5 percent (+1,500), while statewide jobs grew 0.8 percent.

Looking at industry detail (not seasonally adjusted), the seven published supersectors were all essentially unchanged from February. Over the year, trade, transportation, & utilities had the largest movement, up 600.

FOOTNOTES

V Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

2/ Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

3/ Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.

4/Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
