CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA APRIL UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 3.2%

HARRISBURG (MAY 28) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) decreased one-tenth of a percentage point in April to 3.2 percent, the lowest rate since March 2007. The Chambersburg-Waynesboro and Harrisburg-Carlisle MSAs tied for the fourth-lowest unemployment rate among the state's 18 MSAs. The Gettysburg and State College MSAs tied for the lowest rate at 2.9 percent, while the East Stroudsburg and Scranton--Wilkes-Barre--Hazleton MSAs had the highest at 4.7 percent. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for Pennsylvania and the United States were 3.8 percent and 3.6 percent, respectively.

Franklin County's unemployment rate tied Bucks and Butler counties for the 10th lowest rate among Pennsylvania's 67 counties in April. Unemployment rates and rankings of neighboring counties were: Fulton (3.7%, t-24th); Huntingdon (4.8%, 65th); Juniata (3.5%, t-18th); Perry (3.0%, t-6th); Cumberland (2.8%, 2nd); and Adams (2.9%, t-3rd). Unemployment rates across Pennsylvania ranged from 2.6 percent in Chester County to 5.5 percent in Forest County.

The Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA's *seasonally adjusted* total nonfarm jobs were up 400 from March to 63,100, a record high. Over the year, jobs were up 3.3 percent (+2,000), while statewide jobs grew 1.0 percent.

Looking at industry detail (not seasonally adjusted), over the month, manufacturing jobs increased 400, rebounding from a subpar February. The remaining six published supersectors were all essentially unchanged. Over the year, all published supersectors were either up or unchanged. Trade, transportation, & utilities, up 500, had the largest gain.

FOOTNOTES

V Estimate of workers by place of residence. These data are controlled to state Current Population Survey (CPS) data which adjusts for commuting and dual job-holding. Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.

2/ Includes wage and salary workers (including agriculture), self-employed persons, and unpaid family workers (including agriculture), domestic workers, and persons involved in labor-management disputes.

3/ Unemployed as percent of civilian labor force, computed using unrounded data.

4/Seasonally adjusted MSA level data (and their equivalent) is developed by the federal Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS); seasonal adjustment for all other sub-state areas are developed by CWIA.
