Local Unemployment Rate 3.3%

On August 27th the Pa Department of Labor and Industry reported that the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 3.3%. Franklin County tied for the sixth lowest unemployment rate in the entire state in July. Additionally, the Department reported that over the past year, jobs in the County were up 1.8%, or 1,100. Statewide job growth was reported to be .5%. Finally, there were more than 2,300 online job postings for Franklin County in May which represented an increase of more than 130 postings since May 2018.

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F&M Trust to Acquire Former Danfoss Drives Property in Chambersburg



Franklin Financial Services Corporation and its subsidiary F&M Trust recently announced plans to relocate their corporate headquarters and operations center to a larger, state-of-the-art building at 1500 Nitterhouse Drive in Chambersburg. The bank is purchasing the former Danfoss manufacturing facility for \$7 million from CFDC, LLC, an entity jointly owned by the FCADC and the

Chambersburg Area Development Corp. (CADC). The 67,000 square-foot LEED Gold certified building, constructed in 2009 on an 11-acre parcel. F&M Trust is selling its 41,000 square-foot corporate headquarters located at 20 South Main Street, for \$3.3 million to CFDC. F&M will continue to provide lobby and retail services in downtown Chambersburg, however the second and third floor professional office spaces will be available made available for lease from CFDC. The move to Nitterhouse Drive is expected to be completed in late 2020 after the bank has completed renovations. The facility will house 145 employees with room to add more in the future.

Penn State and Lightsource BP Partner on Major "Solar Farm" Facility

On September 6th Penn State University and Lightsource BP held a ground breaking ceremony for a 70 megawatt "solar farm" which will be located in Newburg. The project is the

largest "solar farm" currently under development in the Commonwealth. In addition to Penn State President Dr. Eric Baron, Governor Wolf also provided remarks at the event. The project represents an estimated \$75 Million investment by Lightsource BP. Lightsource is a division of energy giant, BP. According to Penn State, the project will provide 25% of the University's annual power demand and will help to reduce University Park's carbon footprint by an estimated 35%.

BWise manufactures over 100 different trailer models under the BWise and Bri-Mar brands. ATW brands include Big Tex Trailers, PJ Trailers, CM Truck Beds, and RC Trailers. Locally, BWise operates in a 414,000 SF production facility on Wayne Avenue.
