CHAMBERSBURG-WAYNESBORO MSA AUGUST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE 3.5%

HARRISBURG (OCTOBER 1) – The seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for the Chambersburg-Waynesboro Metropolitan Statistical Area (MSA) increased two-tenths of a percentage point in August to 3.5 percent. Over the year, the unemployment rate for the MSA was down two-tenths of a percentage point. The Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA tied the Lebanon and York-Hanover MSAs for the fifth-lowest unemployment rate among the state's 18 MSAs. The Gettysburg and State College MSAs had the lowest rate at 2.9 percent, while the East Stroudsburg MSA had the highest at 4.9 percent. The seasonally adjusted unemployment rates for Pennsylvania and the United States were both unchanged from July at 3.9 and 3.7 percent, respectively.

Franklin County's unemployment rate tied Lebanon and York counties for the eighth-lowest rate among Pennsylvania's 67 counties in August. Unemployment rates and rankings of neighboring counties were: Fulton (4.0%, t-19th); Huntingdon (5.7%, t-64th); Juniata (4.2%, t-29th); Perry (3.6%, t-11th); Cumberland (3.2%, t-5th); and Adams (2.9%, t-1st). Unemployment rates across Pennsylvania ranged from 2.9 percent in Adams, Centre, and Chester counties to 6.2 percent in Forest and Snyder counties.

The Chambersburg-Waynesboro MSA's seasonally adjusted total nonfarm jobs were up 100 from August to 63,000, tying the record high. Over the year, jobs were up 1.4 percent (+900), while statewide jobs grew 0.6 percent.

Looking at industry detail (not seasonally adjusted), over the month, government and trade, transportation, & utilities gained 200 each as some school districts started their new school year. Over the year, four of the seven published supersectors were up and two were unchanged.

Workers are counted where they live only once regardless of the number of jobs they may hold. All in-depth inquiries relative to the estimating methodology should be addressed to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor. All data are subject to revision during annual benchmarking.
