Repository of Socio-Economic Information: We pride ourselves on being able to provide relevant up-to-date information about all aspects of Franklin County. If we don't have the information in-house, we can direct you to someone who does.

Site Location: We maintain an active inventory of available buildings and sites across the County. If you are looking for an existing building or a build-to-suit location, I encourage you to contact our office. (As a qualifier to what I just stated, currently, there are far fewer available industrial buildings in the County than one might think.)

Low-Interest Financing: As Franklin County's only Certified Economic Development Organization (CEDO) as designated by the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development, the FCADC administers several low interest financing programs. In addition, we created the Franklin County First Fund, which is a revolving loan fund designed to support small business investments.

Community Connector: Since 1986, our office has established collaborative working relationships with local, state, and federal stakeholders to whom we can connect you. Our "connector" role has been increasingly important in supporting business retention, attraction, and start-ups.

Education & Workforce Development: We are actively engaged with our educational providers and workforce development agencies in support of initiatives that address myriad challenges currently facing employers.

Letterkenny Army Depot Breaks Ground on New Facility

April Groundbreaking Marks Latest Project in Modernization Efforts

On April 9th, COL Donald Santillo, Commander, Letterkenny Army Depot was joined by officials from Army Materiel Command (AMC) at a groundbreaking ceremony on a 50,000 square foot shipping and receiving facility. The project represents the latest development in the Depot's modernization efforts. The state-of-the-art facility will serve ground support equipment and guided missile systems, along with the parts and components for these systems. The facility is essential to the safe staging, loading, and offloading of assets and components that consist of PATRIOT air defense battalions, Avenger and Sentinel air defense weapon systems throughout the US armed



forces and our allies around the world. Other officials attending the ceremony included Ms. Marion Whicker, Executive Deputy to the AMC Commanding General and Major General Thomas O'Connor, Commanding General, US Army Aviation and Missile Command.

Walmart Opens New Logistics Center in Greencastle

2.5 Million Square Feet Designed to Expedite Orders

On May 21st, local community leaders joined Walmart associates and managers to formally open Walmart's latest "next generation" fulfillment center on Ebberts Spring Court in Greencastle (Antrim Township). The Greencastle fulfillment center is Walmart's fourth next generation facility. The next generation facilities utilize state of the art, highly automated systems for selecting and packaging orders. Combined with the retailer's existing logistics network, 95% of the US population will be within reach of



one-to-two-day shipping services. When fully operational, the Greencastle facility is expected to employ more than 1,000 workers.

J&J Pallet Recycling LLC Receives PIDA Low Interest Loan

J&J Pallet and Recycling, LLC was recently approved for a 10-year \$367,000 loan at a 5% fixed interest rate from the Pennsylvania Industrial Development Authority (PIDA). The loan was facilitated by the FCADC and will help with the purchase of an existing 16,400 square foot facility in the Cumberland Valley Business Park in Chambersburg. J&J has outgrown its current rental space and needs its own building for future operation. The company will also be making facility improvements including the purchase and installation of four overhead dock doors, grading of the dock area and placement of a concrete pad for outside storage. The total project cost is \$1,780,000. In addition to the PIDA loan, Patriot Federal Credit Union provided \$1.1 Million of financing, and the FCADC made a \$250,000 low interest loan via our Franklin County First Fund . The project with result in the retention of 10 full-time jobs.

Governor Shapiro Visits Martin's Famous Pastry Shoppe

Announces State Support of Expansion Project

On May 1st, Governor Josh Shapiro joined leadership from Martin's Famous Pastry Shoppe to announce that the company is nearing completion of a \$123.2 million expansion of its existing manufacturing facility. The expansion will add an additional 295,000 square feet and will create at least 127 new jobs over five years while retaining more than 659 current employees. The Governor announced an incentives package facilitated by the FCADC and the Governor's Action Team working together in support of the project. The package includes \$635,000 of PA First Fund support and a \$34,000 workforce development training grant. According to Martin's president, Tony Martin, "When PA businesses



are strong, they create new opportunities and more good jobs, which leads to successful, stable communities where we can raise our families and pursue the American dream. We appreciate Governor Shapiro's support of our business and other PA businesses."

John L. Grove Award Lifetime Achievement Award

Manufacturer's Association of Southcentral PA Event held May 22nd.

The late John L. Grove was awarded the lifetime achievement award, the *Manufacturing Trailblazer* from the Manufacturer's Association of Southcentral PA. Mr. Grove left an unmatched legacy for his community and the entire industry – known as the "Father" of the hydraulic crane industry and the "Founder" of the aerial lift industry. He was the founder of two global companies, Grove Manufacturing, now Manitowoc Crane in Shady Grove and JLG in McConnellsburg, now part of Oshkosh Corporation, both with a significant footprint in Franklin County. Today these companies employ thousands of skilled workers and are global market leaders in their industries. John retired in 1993 from JLG with over 60 patents and was inducted into the national Hall of Fame of the Association of Equipment Manufacturers as well as many other awards and recognitions. He spent the rest of his life investing in his community including the establishment of the John L. Grove Medical Center in Greencastle and the Shippensburg University John L. Grove College of Business.

H-2A Visa Program for Farmers

The PA Department of Labor and Industry administers and manages two Foreign Labor Certification Programs for the US Department of



Labor. Under the H-2A Visa Program, agricultural employers can hire seasonal and migrant foreign workers in the USA to perform temporary agricultural labor. The farmer or grower must certify that there are no sufficient US workers to fill the jobs and that the H-2A workers will not adversely affect the terms and conditions of similarly employed US workers. Finally, jobs must be posted with the PA CareerLink system for a specific period to allow US workers time to apply.
