






Skilled Talent

Franklin County's strategic location along Interstate 81 plays a vital role in attracting skilled talent from the Quad-State Region, including Maryland, West Virginia, and Virginia, as well as neighboring counties across southcentral Pennsylvania. The region is home to a robust civilian labor force of over **625,000** highly skilled and reliable workers, all within a 50-mile radius of the heart of Franklin County. This workforce is a cornerstone of the county's economic growth and development.

In 2024, total jobs in Franklin County were up 2% reaching 62,100, outpacing statewide averages. Labor participation rates average 60%.

There are more than 3,422 registered businesses in Franklin County. Franklin County's world-class manufacturers were the driving force behind the local economy in 2024, contributing over **\$1.4 billion** to the County's GDP-the highest of any sector. Healthcare and Transportation/Logistics also played significant roles, each contributing nearly **\$800 million.** Across all sectors, Franklin County's total GDP reached an impressive **\$7.5 billion** in 2024, underscoring the county's economic strength and diverse industry base.

Agribusiness continues to be a major component of Franklin County's economy.

The county proudly ranks **2nd** in the state for the production of milk, cattle, apples, peaches, and corn for silage. To date, over **19,500** acres of agricultural land and **157** family farms have been preserved, ensuring the sustainability of local farming for future generations.

Taxes

Pennsylvania offers a business-friendly tax environment by not levying taxes on inventory, tangible personal property, machinery, or equipment. Additionally, machinery and equipment used directly in the manufacturing process are exempt from state sales tax, providing significant savings for manufacturers.

The following is a summary of the most common business taxes.

Personal Income Tax (PIT) The current rate is **3.07%**.

Tourism

Tourism is a vital contributor to Franklin County's economy, drawing more than **500,000** visitors annually. These visits generate a direct economic impact of **\$378 million,** supporting **1,850 hotel rooms** and over **2,500 hospitality jobs.** The tourism industry not only boosts local businesses but also highlights the unique attractions and vibrant culture that make Franklin County a premier destination.

Corporate Net Income Tax (CNI)

The current rate is **7.99%.** (.05% reduction for each subsequent year until the rate reaches 4.99%... the 9th lowest in the Country.)

Sales & Use (SUT) Tax The current SUT is 6.0%.
